502. HR Recruitment process update, status of trustees and Selection Committee composition

Bevin mentioned that the Selection Committee for recruitment of new Trustees in October & November will consist of: Josie as the Chair, Allison volunteered, and another Board member is invited to participate. At the present time, we know there are two Trustees who will be leaving the Board. Gord recommended to start soliciting now and to think about gender equality.

503. Monitoring Board work

Bevin brought forward the Board Calendar to ensure Board members were aware of the time line as well as some changes to standard items for meetings agendas for the year.

504. Relationship Building & Influence presentation

Elizabeth informed the Board that she has been elected vice chair of the Association of BC Public Library Directors. She then shared information she learned about relationship building & influence from a session with Ken Haycock. Some of the universal principals they discussed were: the power of "liking", reciprocity, social proof and consensus, authority, core values and beliefs, scarcity, and networking.

505. Secure Bike parking proposal

Following the distribution to the Board of the RMOW's and the Transportation Advisory Group's proposal to start a pilot project to keep bikes

secure in the parking lot below the library, the Board discussed ramifications of this proposal. They are asking for permission to put a locked temporary cage for bikes storage in two parking spots. The library would not be part of the business and it would be a trial for a period of 6 months. The Board expressed their support for this proposal.

600. Old Business Make Life Better

601. Cornucopia 2018

Gord reminded everyone of the plant sale this weekend and that a few spots still needed to be filled for Ironman. Members of the Board indicated their availability to fill the remaining places. He summarized the work to be done by the Fundraising Committee for Cornucopia. The decision was made that the raffle prizes would be a year supply of wine and the helicopter ride and tour of the Pemberton Icecap. The feasibility and availability of these prizes will be managed by the Fundraising Committee. Gord presented a proposed budget that would be required to participate in the Fundraising project connected with Cornucopia.
