Letter from the Library Director

2010 – it came at last. Whistler became one big Olympic venue, and Whistler Public Library was definitely part of the action.

January 29 was our last day of normal operations, and an army of workers of all stripes descended upon us, remaking our library into Whistler Canada Olympic House. Much of the furniture and about half of the library collection was removed or disguised. A massive audiovisual system with two giant projection screens was installed. As this transformation took place, the library staff was redeployed to a variety of jobs and locations within the municipality; many of us stayed in the same location, acting as hosts (and sometimes bartenders) for events put on by municipal, provincial, and federal governments, as well as the Canadian Olympic Committee.

Library patrons were encouraged to take out as many books as they liked for a 6-week period, and they were also invited to community events every Saturday, including four pancake breakfasts served from the circulation desk, with themed activities and performers. After the Games wrapped up, the army came again to put things back more or less the way they were. We reopened with modified hours on March 8, and hosted events as Whistler Paralympic House in the evenings. Normal operating hours resumed on March 22. What a time! I don't think many librarians can claim anything like what we experienced in February and March of 2010 on their professional resume. It was exhilarating, stressful, amazing, and incredibly challenging, and we wouldn't trade it for anything.

While it's true that the year did not end in March, normal operations seemed pretty tame after the adrenaline rush of the Olympics. However, we again exceeded all expectations regarding patron visits and circulation. Accounting for the time closed, our statistics are very close to the previous year. It has become clear to the library staff and Board of Trustees that the library is a continuing success: truly Whistler's Living Room.


